Speakers' profile

Alberto Dellepiane started his career in 1992 in the maritime business as chartering manager's assistant at K.M.E., broker at Offshore Shipbrokers and then in Banchero Costa. From 1996 till 2001 he worked as Procuring Manager at Terminal Rinfuse Genova managing an ambitious investment plan in new industrial plants that led the company to a peak 2 million tons dry bulk handled. In 2002 he joined his family company Rimorchiatori Riuniti contributing to the restructuring of the harbour towage business with particular focus on the labour organization. Currently, he is Managing Director for Italy at MedTug S.p.A., CEO of Rimorchiatori Riuniti Porto di Genova, Rimorchiatori Salerno and S.E.R.S., Director of Rimorchiatori Augusta, Rimorchiatori Mediterranei and Tripmare and Chairman of Assorimorchiatori.

James Herbert started his career as a British army officer before training as a BBC journalist. He joined the Shell group rising to head of group media relations where he handled numerous tanker incidents. After a period as a senior UK civil servant, Mr Herbert formed his own communications consultancy specialising in the shipping industry and also providing crisis communications services to shipowners. He has 25 years' experience of international marine casualty including deploying on site and working with major coastal state authorities including the UK Maritime and Coastguard Agency and the US Coast Guard. He has served the ISU for more than 12 years as the Union's communication adviser and it is since 2022 its Secretary General.

Ben Harris began his career with Shipowners' Club after graduating from university and subsequently qualified as a solicitor in England and Wales. In 2010 he moved to Vancouver as a Director of the Club's Canadian Branch office where he was responsible for the Club's claims service across Canada and the west coast of the US. In 2013 Ben returned to London to reprise his current role with the company heading up the Claims team responsible for assisting our Membership across Europe, Africa, the Middle East and Indian sub-continent and the Americas. He is currently Chair of the International Group of P&I Clubs' Salvage Committee.

Additionally, he has held an active role in the Royal Navy reserves, commanding both at sea and ashore.
